TE FA'A NO TE 'ORI 2024 AWARDS

- 1st, 2ND, and 3rd, place prizes will be awarded to ages 5 – 50+
- Jr. Overall Tamāroa and Tamahine certificate & cash prize will be awarded to ages 5-17 years **Advanced Division Only**.
- An Overall Tane and Vahine certificate and cash prize will be awarded to the ages 18 and up division.

MASTER CLASS AWARDS: The top-scoring dancer will receive a round-trip ticket to Tahiti, to compete in the Ori Tahiti Nui world championship. Dancers who have won overall or taken 1st place in an advanced division. Must be 18-35 yrs. old.

Soloists must participate within their division and age category.

SOLO COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

DANCER CRITERIA

BEGINNER SKILL LEVEL

- Dancer must **NOT** have made finals or placed in ANY Tahitian Dance Competition
- Dancers **MUST** have their Pupu Ori (Group Director) email the beginner dancer confirmation form stating they have never placed or made finals in any Tahitian Dance Competition. If the participant is an independent dancer ages 5-17, they can have a parent sign to verify that they have never made finals or placed in any Tahitian Dance Competition. Beginner dancer applications without receipt of director verification **WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.**

ADVANCED SKILL LEVEL

- Dancers who do not meet the above criteria will be considered experienced and **MUST** compete in the advanced category of their age division. Ages 5-17yr divisions.

MASTER CLASS

- Dancers must have placed overall, or 1st place in the advanced division to enter.
You will be required to have a themed solo in this category.

AWARDS

- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. place awards will be presented for each category in the Beginner and Advanced divisions. We will also award (6) Overall Winners. Junior overall Tamahine, Tamāroa, Taure'are'a division for ages 5 to 17, Senior overall Tane and Vahine for ages 18 to 49, and Tane and Vahine 50+. These overall dancers will be chosen from 1st place winners in the ***Advanced Division only***. There will be no overall winner in the beginner divisions.

JUDGING CRITERIA

TECHNICAL AREAS: Variety and difficulty of dance steps, confidence, endurance, and knowledge of traditional steps and Fa'arapu or Pa'ote. Minimum of 5 traditional steps.

ARTISTIC AREAS: Costume, gestures, grace and elegance, creativity, facial and body expressions, ease and comfort with the dance, and how your movements flow with the (Pehe) drumbeats.

MASTER CLASS DIVISION JUDGING CRITERIA: *Themed solo required.*

TECHNICAL AREAS: You will be judged on the variety and difficulty of dance steps, confidence, endurance, and knowledge of traditional steps.

ARTISTIC AREAS: Costumes, gestures, grace and elegance, creativity, facial and body expressions, ease and comfort with the dance, and how your movements flow with the drumbeats. Judges will also look at how cohesive your costume and routine are with your selected theme.

PEHE (DRUM BEATS)

Our house drummers will provide drum beats for prelims, finals, and Master Class divisions

Beginner: 1:30 min

Advanced 1:30 min

Master Class: 1:50 min

Costumes

TAMAHINE/TAURE'ARE'A/VAHINE

- Print or solid pareo in traditional tapa, cotton, 50/50 blend, or rayon. **NO** silk, satin, knits, or synthetics are allowed
- Pareo may **NOT** be **MORE THAN (2 INCHES) ABOVE THE KNEE TOP, OR BELOW THE BOTTOM OF THE KNEE, *this will be strictly enforced.*** No rolled or fringe pareo. Tie pareo to the right or left side, **NO** slit on the opposite side will be allowed. Pareo length will be measured before dancers go on stage. Excessively short pareo or showing of underwear will receive a penalty point deduction of ten (10) points and will be subject to disqualification.
- Hei Upo'o (Head Hei) must be worn and can be no higher than 12 inches. Head adornments are encouraged to be made of fresh flowers, leaves, shells, feathers, and other naturally existing materials. **SILK, PLASTIC, OR FOAM FLOWERS AND FOLIAGE ARE PROHIBITED. NO HOT GLUE. Soloist will receive a penalty point deduction of ten (10) points.**
- Neck and Chest pieces are allowed and cannot extend past the shoulders.
- No rolled or fringe pareo
- Use of handheld props or implements whether attached to the costume or not, is prohibited, and the soloist will receive a penalty point deduction of ten (10) points.

TAMAROA/TAURE'ARE'A/TANE

- Print or solid tihere or malo in traditional tapa, cotton 50/50 blend. **NO** silk, satin, knits, or synthetics are allowed
- Use of handheld props or implements or hip bands whether attached to the costume or not, is prohibited, and the soloist will receive a penalty deduction of ten (10) points.
- Hei Upo'o (Head Hei) must be worn and can be no higher than 12 inches. Head adornments are encouraged to be made of fresh flowers, leaves, shells, feathers, and other naturally existing materials. **SILK, PLASTIC, OR FOAM FLOWERS AND FOLIAGE ARE PROHIBITED. NO HOT GLUE. Soloist will receive a penalty point deduction of ten (10) points.**
- Chest and neck pieces are allowed, and cannot extend past the shoulders
- Knee adornments are allowed, but must only be 6 inches long (no exceptions)
- Wrist and ankle garland are optional.
