- Jr. Overall Tamāroa and Tamahine certificates & cash prizes will be awarded to ages 5-17 years in the Advanced Division Only.
- Overall Tane and Vahine certificates and cash prizes will be awarded in the ages 18 and up division.
- Masterclass 1st, 2nd, 3rd place prizes will be awarded.

Solo Dance Competition Rules and Regulations

Solo Age Divisions and Categories:

1- 4 Exhibition

Junior Division

5-9 Beginner/Intermediate & Advanced

10-13 Beginner/Intermediate & Advanced

14-17 Beginner/Intermediate & Advanced

Senior Division

18-24 One Category

25-34 One Category

35-44 One Category

45-49 One Category

Diva Division

50+ One Category

Soloists must participate within their division and age category. (This will be strictly enforced and verified)

Master Class (One Category)

Vahine and Tane dancers who have placed overall, or 1st place in an advanced category, within the past two years in any Tahitian dance competition. They must be between 18 and 35 years old.

Solo Registration Fees - US Dollars:

- Ages 1 – 4 years Exhibition
 - Free
- Ages 5 – 17 years (Beginner/Advanced divisions):
 - Early registration: \$60
 - Late registration: \$70
- Ages 18 and above (ONE DIVISION):
 - Early registration: \$70
 - Late registration: \$80
- Master Class:
 - Early registration: \$100
 - Late registration: \$150

Registration fees are Non-Refundable, Non-Transferable, and Non-changeable, & cannot be forwarded.

Dancer Criteria:

BEGINNER SKILL LEVEL

- Dancers must NOT have advanced to the finals round or placed in ANY Tahitian Dance Competition.
- Beginner dancers aged 5-17 who are independent dancers can have a parent sign to confirm they have never advanced to the finals round or placed in any Tahitian Dance Competition.
- For dancers under the direction of a Pupu Ori (Group Director), the director must sign and email the beginner dancer confirmation form verifying that the dancer has never advanced to the final round or placed in any Tahitian Dance Competition.
- Applications from beginner dancers without director verification will not be processed.

ADVANCE SKILL LEVEL

- Dancers who do not meet the above criteria will be considered experienced and MUST compete in the advanced category of their age division (ages 5-17 years).

MASTER CLASS

- Dancers must have placed overall or achieved 1st place to enter this division. A theme is required for this category. Pehe (Drumbeats), will be provided by our house drummers.

AWARDS

- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards will be presented for each category in both the Beginner and Advanced divisions. Additionally, we will award four Overall Winners: Junior Overall Tamahine, Tamāroa, Taure'are'a division for ages 5 to 17, and Senior Overall Tane and Vahine for ages 18 to 50+. These overall dancers will be chosen from the 1st place winners in the Advanced Division only. There will be no overall winner in the Beginner divisions.

Judging Criteria:

TECHNICAL AREAS: Variety and difficulty of dance steps, confidence, endurance, and knowledge of traditional steps, including Fa'arapu or Pa'ote. A minimum of five traditional steps is required.

ARTISTIC AREAS: Costume, gestures, grace and elegance, creativity, facial and body expressions, ease and comfort with the dance, and how your movements flow with the Pehe (drumbeats).

Judging Criteria (Master Class Division): *Themed solo required.*

TECHNICAL AREAS: You will be judged on the variety and difficulty of dance steps, confidence, endurance, and knowledge of traditional steps.

ARTISTIC AREAS: You will be judged on costumes, gestures, grace and elegance, creativity, facial and body expressions, ease and comfort with the dance, and how your movements flow with the drumbeats. Judges will also evaluate how cohesive your costume and routine are with your selected theme.

Pehe - Drumbeats

Drumbeats for prelims, finals, and Master Class divisions will be provided by our house drummers.

Beginner: 1:30 min

Advanced: 1:30 min

Master Class: 2:00 min

Costumes

TAMAHINE/TAURE'ARE'A/VAHINE

- Vahine must wear a **plain or Polynesian print** rayon or cotton pareo tied to the side of the hip.
- Pareo must be tied 1-2 inches above the knee. *Ten (10) points will be deducted if the pareo is more than 3 inches from the top of the knee. This will be strictly enforced, and pareo length will be measured before dancers go on stage.*
- No rolling of the pareo is allowed.
- The pareo must be tied to the right or left side with no slit on the opposite side.
- Only fresh or natural adornments are allowed. **No silk, synthetic, or plastic floral materials are permitted.**
- Neck/Chest pieces are allowed but cannot extend past the shoulders.
- No hip adornments or hand-held items are allowed.
- A Hei Upo'o (Head Hei) must be worn and cannot be higher than 12 inches. *(measured from the ear up)*

TAMAROA/TAURE'ARE'A/TANE

- Tane must wear a **plain or Polynesian print**, tihere, or maro style pareo. *Ten (10) points will be deducted if the pareo comes apart.*
- Only fresh, dry, or natural floral/plant materials are allowed. **No silk or plastic floral materials are permitted.**
- Neck/Chest pieces are allowed but cannot extend past the shoulders.
- Leg adornments are allowed but must only be 6 inches long (no exceptions).
- Arm adornments are allowed.
- No hips, waist adornments, or hand-held items are allowed.
- A Hei Upo'o (Head Hei) must be worn. must be worn and cannot be higher than 12 inches. *(measured from the ear up)*

Solo Application: ONLINE REGISTRATION ONLY

To complete your online application, you **must** attach the following scanned documents:

1. A signed Hold Harmless Agreement.
2. A signed Director Verification Form (required for those entering a beginner category).

Steps to Follow:

1. Print out the Hold Harmless Agreement and Director Verification Form.
2. Complete and sign both documents.
3. Scan the signed documents or take clear photos of them with your phone.
4. Attach the scanned copies to your online application.
